

Changing Seasons

WINTER (DECEMBER - FEBRUARY)

New Mexico is a land of dramatic shapes and colors, textural contrasts, and stark beauty. This time of year, find blue-green conifers, agaves, and artistic rockwork. Native shrub silhouettes and subtly colored ornamental grasses offer abundant seed heads and habitat for our wildlife. View the snowcapped Sangre de Cristo mountains, sculptures, and artwork throughout.



SPRING (MARCH - MAY)

Apricot and crabapple trees, western sand cherries, and numerous cacti are among the first garden blooms. These early bloomers must be hardy, as it can snow even in mid-May.



SUMMER (JUNE - AUGUST)

Color and fragrance flourish in the Rose & Lavender Walk, perennial borders, and pollinator habitats, attracting butterflies and bees. Observe hummingbird antics from a bench in a shady ramada. Delight in the fragrance of pines in our Woodland and watch for the welcome afternoon monsoon rains. Join us for tours, classes, and concerts!



FALL (SEPTEMBER - NOVEMBER)

Enjoy the crisp days and beautiful light of this transitional season, when dramatic grasses, late-blooming flowers, and tree foliage join in a riot of fall colors and textures. Harvest season yields vegetables from our agricultural terraces and fruit from our orchard, which we donate to local food banks.
